The Ophelia Project, associated with the JFK Memorial Foundation, is a very successful five-year program for 8th through 12th grade girls who are at risk. Twice a month on school campuses during school hours, students meet with mentors and guest speakers to learn a variety of life skills. The Project's goals are to increase GPA's, reduce dropout rates, absenteeism, increase graduation rates and goal setting. In Conjunction with College of the Desert, Ophelia Project offers full-ride, two-year scholarships for Junior College. WCI is one of the Project's major financial supporters.

Galilee Volunteer Opportunities:

Donating Clothes--Safety Guidelines and What We Accept

To ensure the health and safety of our donors, volunteers, employees and customers please review our guidelines prior to scheduling your donation drop off. Follow us on social media and check our website for any changes to these guidelines.

Donation Requirements

- Desert Best Friend's Closet provides no contact donation drop off, and cannot assist donors unloading their cars or transporting items. We do not provide pick-up service.
- Please limit your donations to no more than 2 large bags or boxes. At this
 time, we have limited space and staff. We will be storing items in a
 designated decontamination room for several days before processing.
- We will not accept items over 3 years old. Item's must be free of snags, holes, rips and tears. All zippers must be working, all buttons, hook and eyes must be intact. We will only accept clothing items that have been FRESHLY cleaned and/or new items with tags still on, folded neatly and packaged in

bags or boxes. Bags and boxes cannot be returned. Please do not donate items loose (i.e., clothing just on hangers).

- For accessories, please clean them prior to donating by wiping with cleaning wipes or diluted rubbing alcohol, and placing them in bags or boxes for transport.
- If you or someone in your household has been sick or diagnosed with COVID19, we ask that you refrain from donating your items at this time.
- Donations accepted Mondays and Thursdays. Donations will not be accepted without an appointment.

Read With Me Volunteer Program:

In 2004, Read With Me Volunteers (RWMV) was established in Southern California. Its mission is to help children from a low income, limited English speaking environment develop to their fullest potential by learning to read, comprehend, and speak English while understanding that people care about them as individuals. The program was awarded the Golden Bell Award for Language Acquisition by the California School Board Association for its contribution to the improvement in students' reading scores in the Coachella Valley.

Volunteer Qualifications

- Enjoys reading
- Is fluent in English
- Likes children and is willing to follow the teacher's directions

Is willing to commit 1 to 4 hours a week during the school year.
 While the minimum time commitment is only one day a week for at least 8 weeks during the period October through May, many volunteers are at their schools for the entire 8 months.

Before volunteering, a volunteer must complete the school district's volunteer application and a 40-minute online course on identifying child abuse and neglect. Volunteers decide what grade level they would like to work with and what day(s) of the week they are available. Volunteers are matched with teachers who need help at a specific time that is mutually agreeable. Teachers direct which materials are used, match volunteers with children, and then monitor their progress. There are many materials that are provided, including, for example, flashcards, word sheets, alphabet building blocks, books, and whiteboards. The child reads to the volunteer who helps with pronunciation and with comprehension by asking questions.

If you have been a teacher and/or helped to teach your own children or grandchildren how to read, you can dive right into working with the children. For those who would like more preparation, a group orientation is provided in November and again in January at each school. In addition, training videos are available.

Of the 16 elementary schools that the program serves in the Coachella Valley, four are in Indio – Jackson, Mountain Vista, Oliphant, and Van Buren.

WCI members donate soda can tabs to the Ronald McDonald House, a charity that provides housing near hospitals in 63 countries for families with hospitalized children and gives grants to non-profit organizations.

Indio's Arbor Day

\$500 is donated each year to the city for planting trees in city parks.

Indio K-9 Unit

Proceeds from the K-9 Bingo game and the 50-50 raffles are combined with a donation from the WCI, averaging \$1,200 per year.

SOS (Soldier Organized Services)

WCI donates \$500 per year to this program that provides free transportation for the military service personnel and their families to and from the marine base and airport.

WCI donates \$500 per year to support the non-government funded USO which provides a place for the travelling military.
